## HENRY WELMERINK IS IN VERY SERIOUS CONDITION

The condition of Henry Welmerink, 858 Watson avenue, S. W., who is at Butterworth hospital suffering from delirium tremens and a fractured leg, is so serious that Dr. R. C. Apted is fighting hard to save the man's life. Welmerink's chances to survive are none too good.

Welmerink was injured last week when he was seized with a fainting spell in front of a west side saloon. In the fall his leg was fractured and he was removed to his parents' home. Later he was taken to detention hospital, where his condition became known and on Dr. Apted's orders he was taken to Butterworth hospital. Because of his delirium it is impossible to set the injured leg. Through an error the name of his cousin, John Welmerink, was used as the man who was the victim of the accident.
